Spinal shock is a result of severe spinal cord injury. It usually requires high-impact,

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direct trauma that leads to spinal cord injury and spinal shock. The initial encounter with a patient that has spinal shock is usually under a trauma scenario. Ischemia of the spinal cord can also produce a spinal shock, for example, a hypotensive patient in the medical intensive care unit (ICU) or a post ...
