The Three Rs of Clinical Psychology Doctoral Interviews ...

Structured Interview Structured Interview . A structured interview is a quantitative research method where the interviewer a set of prepared closed-ended questions in the form of an interview schedule, which he/she reads out exactly as worded.. Interviews schedules have a standardized format which means the same questions are asked to each interviewee in the same order (see Fig. 1).

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
